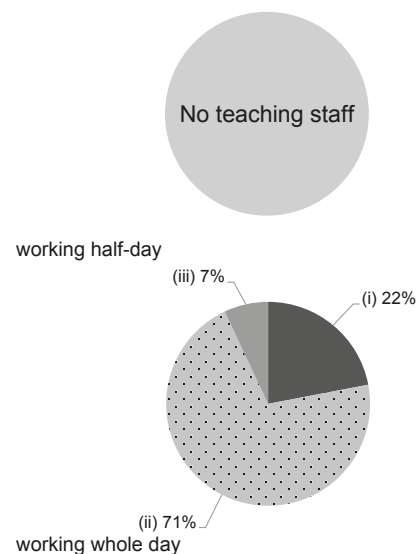

Children of nursery classes will not be asked to write, and there will not be mechanical copying exercises and drills on calculation.</p>

<p>1. Montessori teaching method: enhance cognitive development, learn the spirit of democracy, cultivate problem-solving ability, enhance self-concept, and develop pre-social behavior. 2. Character education activities and cultivate correct values. 3. Activity teaching, individual and group learning: Arrange a variety of games and learning activities, give children the opportunity to explore independently and learn in groups, and promote balanced development.</p>

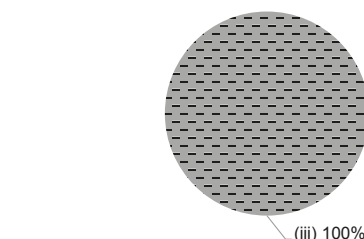
Monthly salary range of principal & teaching staff
